Qualifications-

1. Saved person with a consistent Christian testimony and godly walk
2. A person with a burden and vision that many boys and girls will trust Christ as Savior and become established in their faith.
3. A person with a youthful attitude.
4. Patient, gentle and humble
5. Loves God's Word
6. Must be a member in good standing in order to be a director.
7. May be a professing believer in good standing to be a helper.
8. All AWANA workers must have a background check.

Standards

1. Be on time and ready for each meeting.
2. Contact Director if you can't come or if you will be late. The more notice that we have the better.

4. Be prepared for your role each week.
5. Be loving to children, parents, and other workers. We are ambassadors for Christ.

Duties

Before meeting

1. Try to be early for each club meeting (10 Minutes)
2. Hang out and Fellowship with clubbers before meeting.
3. Help with crowd control before we start.

Flag Ceremonies

1. Be an example to the students around you.
 - a. Be Quiet
 - b. Put your hand over your heart
2. Be the leader
 - a. Take care of clubbers who are not paying attention during the pledges.
 - b. Encourage adults to be quiet and still.

Game Time

1. Do not stay off to the side with other leaders.
2. If you are able, join the games or be a helper.
3. Help control clubbers during game time.

Handbook Time (Sparks & TNT)

1. Each child will be assigned a handbook location with 2-3 other children. They will report to that location each week for handbook time.

2. A "Reader" (adult assigned to help) will be at the station when they arrive.
 - a. The readers will rotate each week to insure that they get to know all of the children and that there is consistency across the board.
 - b. If a child shows up who is not assigned to a group, they may go with the friend who brought them, or the SPARKS/TNT leader will assign them to a group.
 - c. Boys will be with boys and girls with girls. That goes for leaders as well. Men will be with boys and women will be with girls if at all possible.
 - d. Readers, please make sure that every location has record sheet for each child.
3. Maintain discipline during this time by keeping clubbers quiet and monitoring the bathroom and drink trips. (Those should be made between handbook time and game time unless it is an emergency.)
4. Filling out the information on the record sheets or books
 - a. Listen to the sections as the clubbers are prepared to recite them.
 - b. Do not give more than 2 helps per section and the section must be said all at once in order to receive credit.
 - c. Once the section is finished, fill out the information and record it.
 - i. It is imperative that we keep an accurate record of the students achievements and turn them in.
 - d. Every handbook location will be assigned a cubby hole to keep books and records. The students may take their books home but if they would like to keep it in the cubby, they may do so.
 - e. Please put books and record sheet in the cubby when book time is over.
 - f. If a child forgets his/her book, we will have a verse study sheet that they will study. Just because they forgot their book does not mean that they don't study.

Story Time

1. Please sit amongst the children, not with other leaders in the back.
2. Be the example of how to act during the reading of God's Word.
3. Join in the singing and other activities
4. Help out whenever you can with the discipline of the students.
5. Be ready to counsel the students when they respond to the invitation.
